<u>REVIEW OF THE ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO THE POLITICAL GROUPS ON</u> <u>THE COUNCIL</u>

This report reviews the allocation of seats to the Political Groups on the Council.

Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, places a duty on the Council to review the allocation of seats to the political groups at the meeting of Annual Council or as soon as possible thereafter.

Attached to this report is a political balance proposal for the allocation of seats to the political groups. Set out below is the allocation of seats to the political groups on the Council which has been revised to take into account the results of the Borough Council Elections held on 1.5.2003. The minimum number of Members to constitute a political group is two.

Calculation of the Overall Entitlement

For the purpose of this report reference to Committees and sub-Committees applies to the Policy Board and Executive Panels under the Council's new political management arrangements.

The new calculation of the total entitlement of seats to each political group is based on the total number of seats on all the Committees and Sub-Committees (if any) being divided by the total membership of the Council and then multiplying that figure by the number of group members. The calculation is as follows:

79 ÷ 37 x 18 = 39	(38.43)	Liberal Democrat
79 ÷ 37 x 16 = 34	(34.16)	Conservative
$79 \div 37 \times 3 = 6$	(6.40)	Labour

The total entitlement figure is affected by the 'majority requirement', the effect of which is to ensure that the majority of seats on Committees etc. are allocated to the majority group on the Council. Therefore in allocating seats between the political groups there can be some variance with the total entitlement figure.

The Council is required to consider the 'majority requirement' etc. as far as practicable. This allows for the variations in the number of members of groups on certain committees.

The political balance proposal for the allocation of seats to the various political groups has been prepared having regard to the Council structure approved on 6.12.2000. Members will note that it is proposed to leave the Staff Appointments Committee and the Staff Appeals Committee to be appointed as and when required. With regard to the Standards Committee, this falls outside the Political Balance requirements.

Summary

Members are invited to review and adopt the allocation of seats to political groups on the Council and appoint the Policy Board, Executive Panels and Committees for the ensuing year.

MEMBERS' ALLOWANCES 2003/2004 AND APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT RENUMERATION PANEL

At the meeting of the Ordinary Council on 6.12.2000, the Council adopted from 1.1.2001 a new scheme for Members' Allowances under Section 18 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989.

At the meeting of the Policy Board on 18.12.2002, Members considered a report on the budget consultation exercise which had been carried out. The top service which the public wished to see reduced was Mayor and Members' services. The Policy Board decided that an independent review should take place of Members' and Mayor's services. Pending the outcome of the review, the allowances for 2003/2004 will be paid in accordance with the scheme approved in December 2000.

APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT RENUMERATION PANEL

Following the decision of the Policy Board on 18.12.2002, at the Special Council meeting on 26.2.2003, Members considered a report on how the review of Mayor and Members' services should be undertaken.

Under the Local Authorities (Members' Allowances England) Regulations 2001, any decision to amend, revoke or replace a scheme of allowances after 4.5.2001 must involve an Independent Panel set up in accordance with those regulations.

The Council decided amongst other matters to appoint an Independent Renumeration Review Panel, inviting the original independent Members to serve on the Independent Renumeration Review Panel and to advertise for other individuals to serve on the Independent Renumeration Review Panel, the selection of the other independent members to take place following advertisement and interview as detailed in the report.

Of the three original members of the Independent Panel, two indicated they would be happy to serve on the Review Panel. The third member of the Panel had moved away and did not feel it would be appropriate to serve on the Panel. No applications were received following advertisement for independent members of the Panel.

PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCY BOUNDARIES IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX

The Boundary Commission for England is required by the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986, to conduct a general review of all the constituencies in England every eight to twelve years. The Commission completed its previous review on 12.4.95 and a new review is now being undertaken.

The Commission has published its provisional recommendations, based on electorate figures for the year 2000 and in consideration of the average electoral quota for Essex, Southend-on-Sea and Thurrock.

With regard to the Brentwood & Ongar Parliamentary Constituency, the Commission proposes to add the Epping Forest ward of North Weald Bassett to the existing constituency boundary, thereby increasing the electorate by a further 3,315 electors.

The Council has until 16.6.2003 to make any representations in respect of the provisional recommendations.

RECOMMENDED that the Chief Executive & Town Clerk be authorised to respond to the Commission, including raising formal objection if necessary, following consultation with the three political Group Leaders on the Council.
