#### 1. MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENT AND PRESENTATIONS: The Mayor:

- 2. On 6.4.08, had attended the moving 'Remember Me' Service at the Territorial Army Centre in Warley in company with those who had seen active service and the families of those who had been killed in action.
- 3. On 17.4.08, had been pleased to present the awards for the Brentwood Half Marathon and Fun Run. The Mayor also congratulated the Leader of the Council and his father, Mr K Lewis, on completing the London Marathon recently.
- 4. Had enjoyed, on 23.4.08, an evening spent at the Young Enterprise Area Awards at Anglia Ruskin University which included participants from Brentwood.
- 5. On 2.5.08, had attended the opening of a new facility for St Francis Hospice, the Pepperell Education Centre, which would provide learning opportunities for those supporting Hospice patients.
- 6. On 7.5.08, was proud to have presented the Young Person of the Year Awards to four very worthy winners Ian Slade (Young Carer), Robyn Sach (Young Volunteer), April Goulding (Young Achiever) and Chloe Mansell (Young Hero). The overall winner of Brentwood's Young Person of the Year was Ian Slade in recognition of his selfless commitment as the prime carer for both of his parents.
- 7. On 10.5.08, had supported the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society at their 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Sponsored Walk when participants had walked from all over Essex to assemble at Brentwood Cathedral.

- 8. Later that day had hosted the Mayor's Charity Gala Ball at Orsett Hall at which £5,000 had been raised for Childcare the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society and thanked all who had organised or attended the Ball.

The Mayor presented Cr Kenny with a badge to commemorate his year of office.

At the request of the Mayor, and on behalf of the officers of the Council, the CE presented gifts to the retiring Mayor, Cr Kenny.

Cr Kenny thanked the Council and expressed his personal thanks and appreciation for all the help and support from his Secretary, Miss Sarah Furlong and many other Officers, fellow Councillors and members of the community who had assisted him and supported his Chosen Charities during his year of office. Cr Kenny paid particular tribute to his family for their support.

- 8. STANDARDS IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND THE COUNCIL'S STANDARDS COMMITTEE: Members had before them a report setting out the implications of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 to Standards in Local Government and the Council's Standards Committee. The Act and associated guidance brought in significant changes to the procedure for dealing with complaints about the conduct of elected Members. In summary, the main changes were:
  - Local Assessment of all complaints rather than referral to the Standards Board for England
  - Standards Committees had to be chaired by an Independent Member
  - Standards Committees may enter into working relationships with other Standards Committees
  - Standards Committees would report periodically to the Standards Board
  - The Standards Board became a strategic regulator. This role was to provide supervision, support and guidance for local authorities and to ensure a degree of consistency in the application of the code

The DCE advised the Council that, since publication of the report, the final guidance had been issued by the Standards Board which would require some minor amendments to the Terms of Reference published with the report.

#### **RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:**

- 1. To increase the number of Members on the Standards Committee from 8 to 12, comprising 6 Borough Councillors, 3 Independent Members and 3 Parish Councillors.
- 2. To recruit a further Independent (non-councillor) Member in accordance with the procedure set out in the Standards Committee (England) Regulations 2008 (by way of advertisement).
- 3. To request the Brentwood Association of Local Councils to nominate the third Parish Representative to sit on the Standards Committee.

4. To amend the Standards Committee Terms of Reference in accordance with the report and to make any amendments to the Constitution accordingly and that the DCE be authorised, following consultation with the Leader of the Council, authority to further amend the Terms of Reference to ensure full compliance with the latest guidance.

9. APPOINTMENT OF POLICY BOARD, EXECUTIVE PANELS AND COMMITTEES: The Council was invited to review and determine the allocation of seats in accordance with Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989; to determine the number of voting Members on each Committee; and to appoint Committees and allocate seats on the Committees in accordance with the wishes of the political groups on the Council. The reference to 'Committees' applied to the Policy Board and Executive Panels under the Council's political management arrangements.

A political balance proposal for the allocation of seats to the political groups was attached to the report before the Council together with details of the nominations from the political groups to the seats allocated to the political groups on the Policy Board, Executive Panels and Committees. A list of four amendments to the original proposed nominations for the Conservative Group was tabled at the meeting.

In addition, the Council considered changes to the Terms of Reference affecting the former Environment Panel to reflect the creation of the new Highways Panel.

(Members noted that the Staff Appointments and Staff Appeals Committee would be appointed if required and the Standards Committee was not subject to the political balance requirements. Members were reminded that the Licensing/Appeals Committee was adjusted to meet the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 to provide a pool of Members any three of which sitting together could form a Sub-Committee).

**MEMBERS' ALLOWANCES 2008/2009:** The Council had before it a detailed report following a series of meetings of the new Independent Remuneration Panel which had undertaken a full review of the Council's Members' Allowances Scheme.

The Independent Panel had given consideration to the current scheme of Members' Allowances and reflected on whether any changes were necessary or appropriate and had put forward its recommendations for consideration by the Council.

The Panel recommended that the current scheme of allowances should be maintained, albeit subject to an increase of 2.5% in line with the figure set by the Government for Public Sector employees.

In addition, the Panel recommended that a Dependent Carer's Allowance be made available to Members.

The Council acknowledged the time and effort devoted by the Independent Panel members and thanked them for their work in reviewing the scheme and their recommendations. In discussing the report, it was proposed to accept the Panel's recommendations, with the exception of the 2.5% increase in allowances and the introduction of a Dependent Carer's Allowance.
