I am sending this message in regards to recent allegations made against the well known and well loved Cricketers Pub in Mill Green, Fryerning.

I have only been a local to the pub for perhaps 5 years now, but in that time the Cricketers has become a hugely positive part of my life. I had my first date with my long term partner there, I've made life long friends there and my family and I have enjoyed many days together in the pub's gorgeous garden. When I first came to the ingatestone area I knew no one, but thanks to the Cricketers I have found such a strong and loving community of support. After a short while I decided it was a place that I would love to work, 4 years later it is one of the best decisions I have made to this day.

Knowing the pub as both a customer and an employee I have seen all its highs and lows. On a small numbers of occasions the neighbours have bought their to concerns to our attention which I firmly believe we dealt with the utmost sincerity.

One example of this was parking issues outside neighbours property which Rupert Cherryman the pubs proprietor had a meeting with Lord Petre and at his own cost invested his money expanding the common car park area providing extra parking for the community. This was abruptly stopped by the neighbours hence putting pressure back on parking as the pubs success has attracted customers from further afield.

I am not aware of any anti-social behaviour whilst we had events they have been well run and we adhered to council policy on hours and noise levels.


In fact there was more noise coming from the neighbours speaker systems in their gardens often competing with each other who can play the loudest music.


