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I wish to object on behalf of the Environmental Health Pollution Team to this application with regard to the licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance.

This TEN application seeks to amend the condition on last entry time and also proposes an extension of the opening hours until 3.30am on Christmas Day morning, with an extension of licensable activities beyond the currently licensed times, which have already resulted in complaints from residents in the area and would be likely to cause additional disturbance.

In addition, the noise management policy required by the review hearing on 28th June 2021 has not yet been provided and we are not aware of any noise dampening measures that have been implemented, which was also a requirement of the review hearing decision.
