On behalf of the Environmental Health Pollution Team I wish to object to this application. The application proposes an extension of the use of the pub garden until 23:00, which is likely to result in noise disturbance to other residents in the vicinity of the premises later at night.

It would appear that the fireworks display will be accompanied by a disco at the premises, it is unclear whether there will be any music played in the outside area but the licensing conditions restricting this use would potentially be suspended allowing external music performance.

The outside area has caused complaints from the football events earlier in the year and we have continued to receive complaints from residents. The recent Licensing Sub-Committee hearing confirmed the previous restrictions on the hours of use of the pub garden, which would be extended if the TEN is granted, it is likely that an extension of the activities in the outside pub garden will cause complaint.

It would also seem that the pub garden would be in the likely area for fallout from the firework display which is also of concern from a safety aspect.
